# **Bible Study Approach**

For this study, we'll be doing two things:

- 1) devotional bible reading—through the week and
- 2) bible study— on Sunday mornings, digging deep into the text questions welcome 😊



This gives us two different ways to read the bible

- for formation (devotional reading), and
- for information (bible study).

#### **How to Do Devotional Bible Reading**

As Lutheran Christians, we believe God speaks – specifically, that he speaks through His word. The Bible is not only about what God did, but also about what God does. In the same way that He has been active throughout history, He is active today. As so, as we read, we live as if this is true by aiming to become attentive to His voice...as He speaks to us and invites us to act.

### The process:

We'll approach it as we would a conversation with a friend.

First, slow down...in a quiet place. Then pray, "God help me hear you."

Then read the passage for the week, or a portion of it, once or twice. Listen for the word or phrase that strikes you. This word somehow stands out from all the rest, causes a reaction, or brings about a deep sense of resonance or resistance.

Reflect on what stood out using these two questions:

- What is God saying?
  - o ...about Himself
  - o ...about Me
  - ...about the World

- What am I going to do about it?
  - o ... a mindset to adopt or abandon
  - o ...a direction to step into or away from
  - o...a person to pray for or care for
  - ...an example to imitate or avoid

Note your findings somewhere, and bring those notes with you to class.

Matthew 7:24 "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock.

God has things for us to hear that will help form us—mold and shape us to be more and more to be like Jesus.

- Matthew is the bridge between the Old Testament and New Testament
- Audience: Jewish people people familiar with the Old Testament
- Big Question: Does Jesus have the credentials to be "the one that is to come"?
- "Gospel" = "good news"
- Author: Matthew (Levi), the tax collector, eyewitness to the events
- Date: 40-70 AD
- Historical Context:
  - Roman Empire (Julius Caesar) has been ruling for 40 years
  - Pax Romana Peace of Rome, began in 27 BC
  - Jews not excited about Rome ruling over them, they were supposed to be "set apart". They looked eagerly for the day when a leader would come and overthrow Rome.

- "Matthew wanted to show how Jesus is the continuation and fulfillment of the whole biblical story of God and Israel, so he emphasizes that:
  - Jesus is the Messiah from the line of David
  - Jesus is a new, authoritative teacher like Moses
  - Jesus is God with us, or in Hebrew, Immanuel"
- Chapters 1-3: Jesus as Messiah and Immanuel (God with Us)
- Chapters 4-7: Arrival of God's Kingdom and the Sermon on the Mount
- Chapters 8-10: The Kingdom's Power and Invitation to Discipleship
- Chapters 11-13: Different Reactions to Jesus






